# Introduction

## Purpose

The aim of this report is to give the reader an easy access to key census statistics for selected parishes and hence provide contextual information to help better understand communities served by each parish. The maps in the annex help to view the parish in the context of neighbouring areas.

## Report structure

This report presents **summary statistics for each parish** in the deanery of St John the Evangelist, providing: population estimates, age profile, declared religion, occupation and family situation. The report is complemented by a series of seven maps showing location of church buildings, overall population density (2014), population density by religion (2011) and student population (Annex A). The data limitations are discussed in Annex B and the tables showing data for selected characteristics are shown in Annex C. The parishes are presented in the alphabetical order.

## Deanery level overview

Overall, the deanery, consisting of **16 parishes**, covers the area of just under 94 square kilometers (9.4k hectares). The 2014 **population size** was estimated at 234.4k, a 4 percent increase since 2011. Majority of usual residents were **aged** between 36 and 64 (35%), followed by those aged 18 to 35. Only 11 percent of the population was aged under 7. Nearly 64 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian, followed by 23 percent declaring 'no religion' and 4 percent declaring a Muslim belief.

The **number of households** in the deanery was estimated at 100k, of which nearly 40 percent did not have **access to a car** and nearly a half rented their accommodation. Fifty-five per cent of all households were occupied by a family, and 36 percent were one person households, with 12 percent of all households being occupied by **a person over 65 living alone**. About 8 percent fell into other category.

Parishes in the **western half of the deanery** have a slightly higher proportion of Muslim people and students than those in the east, which in turn have higher proportions of retired people. The pattern of population declaring no religion, tends to follow general population, with slightly higher numbers in areas that have non-negligible number of full time students.

It is also worth noting that the **between 2001 and 2011**, when the overall population size in the deanery increased by about 9 percent from 206k to 226k, the Christian population decreased by 9 percent (157.8k to 144.3k). At the same time both Muslim population and group declaring no religion more than doubled. Muslim population increasing from 3.1k to 7.4k and the 'no religion group' from 22.9k to 50.7k.

# Christ the King, Walken

*Parish Priest: Fr Martin J Broadley*

## Area & Population

- Christ the King's parish covers the area of 870 hectares, and the average **population density** is 23 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 17k. This is 2 percent (379 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 16.6k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 7.4k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (40%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 22 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 71 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for only 1 percent of the population, and 20 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (47%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 3 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (65%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 15 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. Nearly a quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 63 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 32 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 5 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 52 percent consist of **married couples**, 18 percent are cohabiting and 17 percent are **lone parents**. Forty three percent of one family households have dependent children, and 13 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 28 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 22 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 85 percent of the parish area.

# Holy Cross, St Matthew and St Gilbert, Eccles

## Area & Population

- Holy Cross, St Matthew and St Gilbert's parish covers the area of 1849 hectares, and the average **population density** is 12 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 22.2k. This is 2 percent (383 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 21.8k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 9.6k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (37%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 26 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 11 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, two thirds of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for only 2 percent of the population, and a quarter of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (42%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 6 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (60%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 12 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupations roles. Twenty seven percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 59 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 35 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 6 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 41 percent consist of **married couples**, 21 percent are cohabiting and 28.4 percent are **lone parents**. Nearly a half of one family households have dependent children, and 9 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 46 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 36 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 101 percent of the parish area.

# Ss Peter and Paul, Pendleton

## Area & Population

- Ss Peter and Paul's parish covers the area of 156 hectares, and the average **population density** is 46 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 7.2k. This is only 1 percent (100 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 7.1k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 3.1k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (40%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 22 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 8 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 70 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 3 percent of the population, and 19 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (44%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 5 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (65%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 14.2 percent being a '**retired person**'. Health industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. A quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 56.3 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 37 percent are one person households (of which 17 percent are 'single, over 65') and 6 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 54 percent consist of **married couples**, 15 percent are cohabiting and 18 percent are **lone parents**. Forty percent of one family households have dependent children, and 14.2 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 33 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 30 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 100 percent of the parish area.

# St Charles, Moorside

## Area & Population

- St Charles's parish covers the area of 600 hectares, and the average **population density** is 25 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 16.5k. This is 2 percent (267 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 16.2k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 6.9k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (39%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 20 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 72 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 1 percent of the population, and 20 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (49%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population, 3 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (65%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 17 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. A quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 67 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 28.6 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 5 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 51 percent consist of **married couples**, 15 percent are cohabiting and 18 percent are **lone parents**. Forty two percent of one family households have dependent children, and 15 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 23 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 20 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 108 percent of the parish area.

# St Edmund, Little Hulton

## Area & Population

- St Edmund's parish covers the area of 665 hectares, and the average **population density** is 35 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 22.8k. This is 4 percent (819 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 22k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 9.5k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (35%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 24 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 13 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 67 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 1 percent of the population, and 24 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (41%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 4 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (53%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 14.2 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupations roles. Twenty eight percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 62 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 32 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 6 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 39 percent consist of **married couples**, 20 percent are cohabiting and 31 percent are **lone parents**. Just over a half of one family households have dependent children, and 10 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 51 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 38 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 99 percent of the parish area.

# St James and All Souls, Salford

## Area & Population

- St James and All Souls's parish covers the area of 491 hectares, and the average **population density** is 42 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 20.8k. This is 3 percent (525 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 20.3k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 9.9k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (36%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 33 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 9 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 63 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 3 percent of the population, and 26 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (54%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 4 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 13 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (50%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 15 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupations roles. Nearly a third of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 45 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 46 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 10 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 35 percent consist of **married couples**, 23 percent are cohabiting and 33 percent are **lone parents**. Forty six percent of one family households have dependent children, and 8 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 67 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 55.7 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 101 percent of the parish area.

# St John's (Cathedral), Salford

## Area & Population

- St John's (Cathedral)'s parish covers the area of 214 hectares, and the average **population density** is 41 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 9.1k. This is 6 percent (531 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 8.6k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.7k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (67%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 23 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 3 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 46 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 5 percent of the population, and 38 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (77%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 11 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 25 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (60%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 25 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. Nearly a quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 30 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 48 percent are one person households (of which 3 percent are 'single, over 65') and 23 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 28.6 percent consist of **married couples**, 51 percent are cohabiting and 18 percent are **lone parents**. A quarter of one family households have dependent children, and 2 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 82 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 57.3 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 103 percent of the parish area.

# St Joseph, Ordsall

## Area & Population

- St Joseph's parish covers the area of 283 hectares, and the average **population density** is 44 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing considerably**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12k. This is 20 percent (2013 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 10k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5.4k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (51%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 27 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 7 percent aged between 8 and 17.
- In the parish area, 54 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 4 percent of the population, and 32 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (64%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 6 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 19 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (64%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 12 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. A fifth of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 39 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 46 percent are one person households (of which 6 percent are 'single, over 65') and 14.2 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 33 percent consist of **married couples**, 37 percent are cohabiting and 26 percent are **lone parents**. Thirty six percent of one family households have dependent children, and 4 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 76 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 43 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 95 percent of the parish area.

# St Joseph the Worker and St Teresa of Avila, Irlam

## Area & Population

- St Joseph the Worker and St Teresa of Avila's parish covers the area of 1932 hectares, and the average **population density** is 10 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 20.2k. This is 3 percent (530 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 19.7k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 8.37k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (37%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 24 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 11 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 71 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 1 percent of the population, and 21 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (44%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 0 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 2 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (64%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 15 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. Twenty seven percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 66 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 28.6 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 5 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 47 percent consist of **married couples**, 18 percent are cohabiting and 22 percent are **lone parents**. Forty seven percent of one family households have dependent children, and 12 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 34 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 25 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 105 percent of the parish area. Please note, no boundary information allowing for the separate statistics for each parish was provided.

# St Luke, Irlams o'-th'-Height

## Area & Population

- St Luke's parish covers the area of 302 hectares, and the average **population density** is 35 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.3k. This is 3 percent (383 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.9k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (38%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 26 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 72 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 2 percent of the population, and 19 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (41%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 4 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (64%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. Twenty seven percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 62 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 31 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 7.09 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 49 percent consist of **married couples**, 19 percent are cohabiting and 21 percent are **lone parents**. Forty four percent of one family households have dependent children, and 11 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 27 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 28.4 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 118 percent of the parish area. The additional 18 percent of area, mainly belonging to St Sebastian's parish is a very sparsely populated area, hence impact on estimates is low.

# St Mark, Pendlebury

## Area & Population

- St Mark's parish covers the area of 433 hectares, and the average **population density** is 28 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.3k. This is 2 percent (290 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 12k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5.5k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (38%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 24 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 72 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 2 percent of the population, and 20 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (39%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- In the parish area, 41 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 35 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 103 percent of the parish area.

# St Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Swinton

*Parish Priest: Fr Barry Lomax*

## Area & Population

- St Mary of the Immaculate Conception's parish covers the area of 509 hectares, and the average **population density** is 29 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing slowly**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 14.2k. This is 2 percent (245 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 13.9k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5.6k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (38%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 27 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged up to 7.
- In the parish area, 69 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 2 percent of the population, and 22 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (42%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 4 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (60%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 12 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. A quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 63 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 32 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 6 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 47 percent consist of **married couples**, 21 percent are cohabiting and 23 percent are **lone parents**. Nearly a half of one family households have dependent children, and 9 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 37 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 30 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 95 percent of the parish area.

# St Mary, Eccles

*Parish Priest: Fr Robert Livesey*

## Area & Population

- St Mary's parish covers the area of 341 hectares, and the average **population density** is 43 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 14.3k. This is 4 percent (529 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 13.8k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 6.56k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (39%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 27 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 9 percent aged between 8 and 17.
- In the parish area, 62 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 7 percent of the population, and 23 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (41%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 2 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 9 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (60%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. A quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 48 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 44 percent are one person households (of which 14.2 percent are 'single, over 65') and 7.09 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 49 percent consist of **married couples**, 21 percent are cohabiting and 20 percent are **lone parents**. Forty three percent of one family households have dependent children, and 9 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 52 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 41 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 98 percent of the parish area.

# St Sebastian and St Boniface, Pendleton

*Parish Priest: unknown*

## Area & Population

- St Sebastian and St Boniface's parish covers the area of 450 hectares, and the average **population density** is 31 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.7k. This is 4 percent (439 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 12.2k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.78k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (43%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 27 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 9 percent aged between 8 and 17.
- In the parish area, 60 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 4 percent of the population, and 27 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (61%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 6 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 15 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (38%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 30 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupations roles. Forty one percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families

- Of all households in the parish, 48 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 39 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 12 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 34 percent consist of **married couples**, 22 percent are cohabiting and 38 percent are **lone parents**. Just over a half of one family households have dependent children, and 7.09 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 72 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 57.3 percent **do not** have access to car.

## Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 90 percent of the parish area.

# St Thomas of Canterbury, Higher Broughton

*Parish Priest: Fr David Macfarlane*

## Area & Population

- St Thomas of Canterbury's parish covers the area of 284 hectares, and the average **population density** is 70 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is increasing**. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 20.8k. This is 4 percent (800 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 20k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 7.44k.

## Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (28%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 27 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 37 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 13 percent of the population, and 10 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (42%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

## Economy

- Of the 2011 population 5 percent **arrived** in two years before the census, and 21 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (48%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in professional services roles. Forty six percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

## Families



- In the parish area, 70 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 52 percent **do not** have access to car.


## Map 2: Location of churches




### **Location of churches**

*This map shows the location of churches in each parish in the deanery.*


**Map 3: Population density, 2014**




Map 4: Christian population density, 2011




Map 5: Muslim population density, 2011

# Annex B: Data Limitations

## Timeliness

The population size for each parish is based on mid-2014 estimates (30<sup>th</sup> June 2014). Remaining analysis is based on Census 2011 data and hence captures the population characteristics as they were on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2011. The socio-demographic characteristics of the population could have changed between then and the time of writing of this report. Some areas, for example where there is a lot of newly built houses or significant student or migrant population will be more dynamic, hence changes over time may be more significant.

## Coverage

Good geographical coverage has been achieved when matching statistical areas to most parish areas, mainly because both statistical area boundaries and parish boundary tend not to cut across main roads. More sparsely populated areas in Trafford were more difficult to match. Since extra area included or removed is mainly industrial, it is thought that population characteristics are not significantly affected. The reported overall population density for affected parishes is most likely an underestimate.

## Data matching

A spatial join between parish areas and 'Population Weighted Centroids' was applied to determine Output Areas which fall within each parish boundary. This automated method assigned nearly 99 percent of all OAs in the deanery to parishes. A very small number (about 1 percent) was manually adjusted, to ensure good coverage and capture of the key population features.

## Non- response

Like any survey, Census also faces issues with non-response. Due to ONS efforts, this is very low, at about 5% nationally. The lowest disaggregation of non-response statistic was available at the Local Authority Level and for the Manchester City it was 89%. This may be slightly different for smaller areas within Local Authority.

## Accuracy and correctness

The answers to Census questionnaire reflect respondents' perception and it is possible that some of the answers are incorrect, due to genuine mistakes or deception. Some of the respondents could also refuse to answer some of the questions. ONS has a methodology for checking responses for internal consistency and removes inconsistent or clearly incorrect entries. This in turn means that the base population for each characteristic may be slightly different.
