Population analysis at the parish level

March 2016

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Introduction

Purpose

The aim of this report is to give the reader an easy access to key census statistics for selected parishes and hence provide contextual information to help better understand communities served by each parish. The maps in the annex help to view the parish in the context of neighbouring areas.

Report structure

This report presents **summary statistics for each parish** in the deanery of St Chad's, providing: population estimates, age profile, declared religion, occupation and family situation. The report is complemented by a series of seven maps showing location of church buildings, overall population density (2014), population density by religion (2011) and student population (Annex A). The data limitations are discussed in Annex B and the tables showing data for selected characteristics are shown in Annex C. The parishes are presented in the alphabetical order.

Coverage and boundary

Due to the statistical area and output area shapes, areas matched for four parishes¹ actually cover over 110 percent of the parish area. The additional, included area in all cases is a very sparsely populated industrial or green area and does not considerably affect presented statistics. Similarly, the parish area not covered in two parishes² with coverage below 90 percent is not a residential area and hence it has negligible effect on the estimates.

Parts of the boundary for four parishes were estimated, as no boundary information was supplied. These are marked on the maps in Annex A. The relevant parts of this report can be revised if the description of these boundaries is provided.

Deanery level overview

Overall, the deanery, consisting of **15 parishes**, covers the area of just under 56 square kilometers (5.6k hectares). The 2014 **population size** was estimated at 214.5k, a 4 percent increase since 2011. Majority of usual residents were **aged** between 36 and 64 (35%), followed by those aged 18 to 35. Only 11 percent of the population was aged under 7. Just over 60 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian, followed by 20 percent declaring 'no religion' and 10 percent declaring a Muslim belief.

The **number of households** in the deanery was estimated at 89k, of which 44 percent did not have **access to a car** and just over a half rented their accommodation. Fifty-five per cent of all households were occupied by a family, and 35 percent were one person households, with 11 percent of all households being occupied by **a person over 65 living alone**. About 10 percent fell into other category.

It is also worth noting that the **between 2001 and 2011**, when the overall population size in the deanery increased by nearly 20 percent from 173.7k to 206.1k, the Christian population decreased by 2 percent (127.9k to 125.2k). At the same time both Muslim population and group declaring no religion more than doubled. Muslim population increasing from 8.2k to 20.3k and the 'no religion group' from 18.3k to 42k.

Christ the King, Newton Heath

Parish Priest: Canon Alan Denny

Area & Population

- Christ the King's parish covers the area of 318 hectares, and the average **population density** is 31 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.3k. This is 3 percent (407 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.9k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5.28k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (36%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 26 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 12 percent aged between 8 and 17.
- In the parish area, two-thirds of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 3 percent of the population, and 21 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (47%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent **arrived** in the UK in two years before the census, and 8 percent arrived between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (48%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**long term sick or disabled**' person. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupation roles. Nearly a third of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 53 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 39 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 9 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 35 percent consist of **married couples**, 18 percent are cohabiting and 40 percent are **lone parents**. Fifty-four percent of one family households have dependent children, and 8 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 63 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 53 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 126 percent of the parish area.

Immaculate Conception, Failsworth

Area & Population

- Immaculate Conception's parish covers the area of 498 hectares, and the average **population density** is 30 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 16.5k.
- Census 2011 estimates the **total number of households** in the parish at 7k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (40%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 20 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 8 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 77 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for only 1 percent of the population, and 16 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (47%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (63%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 17 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. Twenty-seven percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 66 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 30 percent are one person households (of which 15 percent are 'single, over 65') and 4 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 50 percent consist of **married couples**, 16 percent are cohabiting and 20 percent are **lone parents**. Forty-two percent of one family households have dependent children, and 15 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 24 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 26 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 111 percent of the parish area.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Blackley

Area & Population

- Our Lady of Mount Carmel's parish covers the area of 250 hectares, and the average **population density** is 50 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.2k. This is 6 percent (741 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.5k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (35%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 28 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 12 percent aged between 8 and 17.
- In the parish area, 64 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 6 percent of the population, and 22 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (47%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population 3 percent **arrived** in the UK in two years before the census, and 14 percent arrived between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (54%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 11 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupation roles. Twenty-nine percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 52 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 37 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 11 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 41 percent consist of **married couples**, 18 percent are cohabiting and 34 percent are **lone parents**. Fifty-three percent of one family households have dependent children, and 7 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 56 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 49 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 99 percent of the parish area.

St Anne and St Brigid, Ancoats

Area & Population

- St Anne and St Brigid's parish covers the area of 749 hectares, and the average **population density** is 32 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 24k. This is 12 percent (2483 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 21.5k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 10.4k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (46%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 28 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 7 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 53 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 6 percent of the population, and 31 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (63%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population 4 percent **arrived** in the UK in two years before the census, and 18 percent arrived between 2001 and 2011.

- Of all households in the parish, 42 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 39 percent are one person households (of which 8 percent are 'single, over 65') and 19 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 32 percent consist of **married couples**, 33 percent are cohabiting and 31 percent are **lone parents**. Forty-five percent of one family households have dependent children, and 4 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 76 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 56.07 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 102 percent of the parish area.

St Anne, Crumpsall

Area & Population

- St Anne's parish covers the area of 408 hectares, and the average **population density** is 59 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 24k. This is 3 percent (720 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 23.3k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 8.5k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (32%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 28 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 11 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 30 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 45 percent of the population, and 9 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (47%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

St Anne, Higher Openshaw

Area & Population

- St Anne's parish covers the area of 383 hectares, and the average **population density** is 44 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 15.4k. This is 4 percent (581 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 14.8k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 6.3k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (37%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 25 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 11 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 67 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 4 percent of the population, and 21 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. - St Chad's parish covers the area of 236 hectares, and the average **population density** is 40 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 9.3k. This is 8 percent (690 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 8.7k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 3.4k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (51%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 23 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 4 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 34 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 33 percent of the population, and 22 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.

- St Clare's parish covers the area of 702 hectares, and the average **population density** is 20 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 16.8k. This is 5 percent (741 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 16.1k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 7.28k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (37%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 25 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 12 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 66 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 6 percent of the population, and 19 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (43%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 9.8k. This is 2 percent (188 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 9.6k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.3k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (36%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 26 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 12 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 67 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 3 percent of the population, and 21 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. - The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 11.4k. This is 1 percent (167 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.2k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.7k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (39%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 24 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 9 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 71 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 2 percent of the population, and 19 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. - In the parish area, 33 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 33 percent **do not** have access to car.

- Matched census areas covered 104 percent of the parish area.

St Margaret Mary, New Moston

Area & Population

- St Margaret Mary's parish covers the area of 248 hectares, and the average **population density** is 48 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 10.5k. This is 1 percent (127 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 10.4k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.4k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (38%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 24 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 10 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 71 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 2 percent of the population, and 20 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (41%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 3 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (60%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. Twenty-eight percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 65 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 28.6 percent are one person households (of which 12 percent are 'single, over 65') and 7 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 43 percent consist of **married couples**, 19 percent are cohabiting and 28.04 percent are **lone parents**. Forty-nine percent of one family households have dependent children, and 9 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 35 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 31 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 89 percent of the parish area.

St Patrick, Collyhurst

Parish Priest: Fr Gerald Murphy

Area & Population

- St Patrick's parish covers the area of 398 hectares, and the average **population density** is 33 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **is growing**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 12.6k. This is 6 percent (697 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.9k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 5.8k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (39%) are **aged** between 18 and 35, followed by 31 percent aged between 36 and 64, with only 8 percent aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 55 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 9 percent of the population, and 26 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **increased significantly, despite** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (60%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population 5 percent **arrived** in the UK in two years before the census, and 18 percent arrived between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (49%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**student**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupation roles. Twenty-eight percent of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 40 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 45 percent are one person households (of which 8 percent are 'single, over 65') and 15 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 31 percent consist of **married couples**, 26 percent are cohabiting and 39 percent are **lone parents**. Fifty-two percent of one family households have dependent children, and 4 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 84 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 65 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 94 percent of the parish area.

St Stephen, Droylsden

Parish Priest: Fr Peter Tierney

Area & Population

- St Stephen's parish covers the area of 514 hectares, and the average **population density** is 38 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 16.9k. This is 2 percent (331 persons) lower than the Census 2011 estimate of 17.2k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 7.3k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (42%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 21 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 9 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 74 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for only 1 percent of the population, and 19 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (46%) declared their marital status as: '**married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population only 1 percent arrived in the UK between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (65%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 15 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in administrative roles. Just over a quarter of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 66 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 28.6 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 5 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 52 percent consist of **married couples**, 17 percent are cohabiting and 19 percent are **lone parents**. Forty-four percent of one family households have dependent children, and 11 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 25 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 26 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 86 percent of the parish area.

St Willibrord, Clayton

Parish Priest: Fr Michael Job

Area & Population

- St Willibrord's parish covers the area of 227 hectares, and the average **population density** is 50 persons per hectare.
- The parish population size **remains fairly stable**. On 30th June 2014, the total number of usual residents was estimated at 11.5k. This is 1 percent (148 persons) higher than the Census 2011 estimate of 11.3k.
- Census 2011 estimates the total **number of households** in the parish at 4.702k.

Demographics

- Most of the usual residents (35%) are **aged** between 36 and 64, followed by 25 percent aged between 18 and 35, with only 13 percent aged under 7.
- In the parish area, 66 percent of the population declared their **religion** as Christian. Muslims accounted for 4 percent of the population, and 22 percent of all residents declared 'no religion'. The Christian population **decreased in line with** the decrease observed between 2001 and 2011 at the deanery level.
- Most residents in the parish (42%) declared their marital status as: '**single, never married**'.

Economy

- Of the 2011 population 1 percent **arrived** in the UK in two years before the census, and 9 percent arrived between 2001 and 2011.
- Most of the people (53%) in the parish declare their main economic activity as '**employed**', followed by 13 percent being a '**retired person**'. Retail industry gives employment to the largest proportion of economically active people in this area. Those in employment are mainly engaged in elementary occupation roles. Nearly a third of those in employment work less than 30 hours per week.

Families

- Of all households in the parish, 60 percent are occupied by a single **family**, 32 percent are one person households (of which 13 percent are 'single, over 65') and 8 percent falls into 'other' category (mainly shared houses or households with lodgers).
- Of the 'one family' households, 40 percent consist of **married couples**, 18 percent are cohabiting and 33 percent are **lone parents**. Fifty-two percent of one family households have dependent children, and 9 percent are families with all members aged over 65.
- In the parish area, 50 percent of households rent their accommodation, and 44 percent **do not** have access to car.

Data coverage & accuracy

- Matched census areas covered 101 percent of the parish area.

Output area coverage

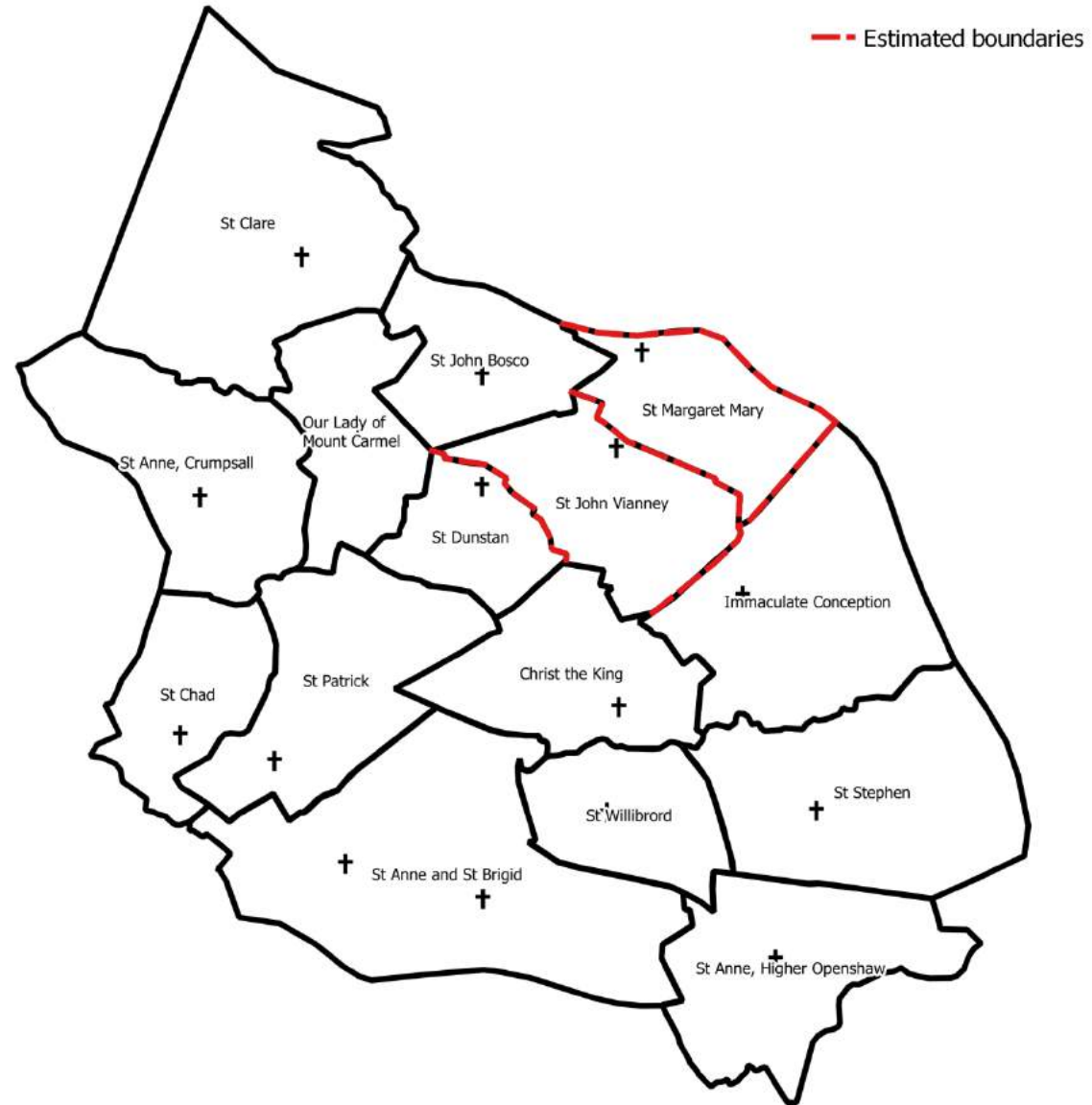

Location of churches

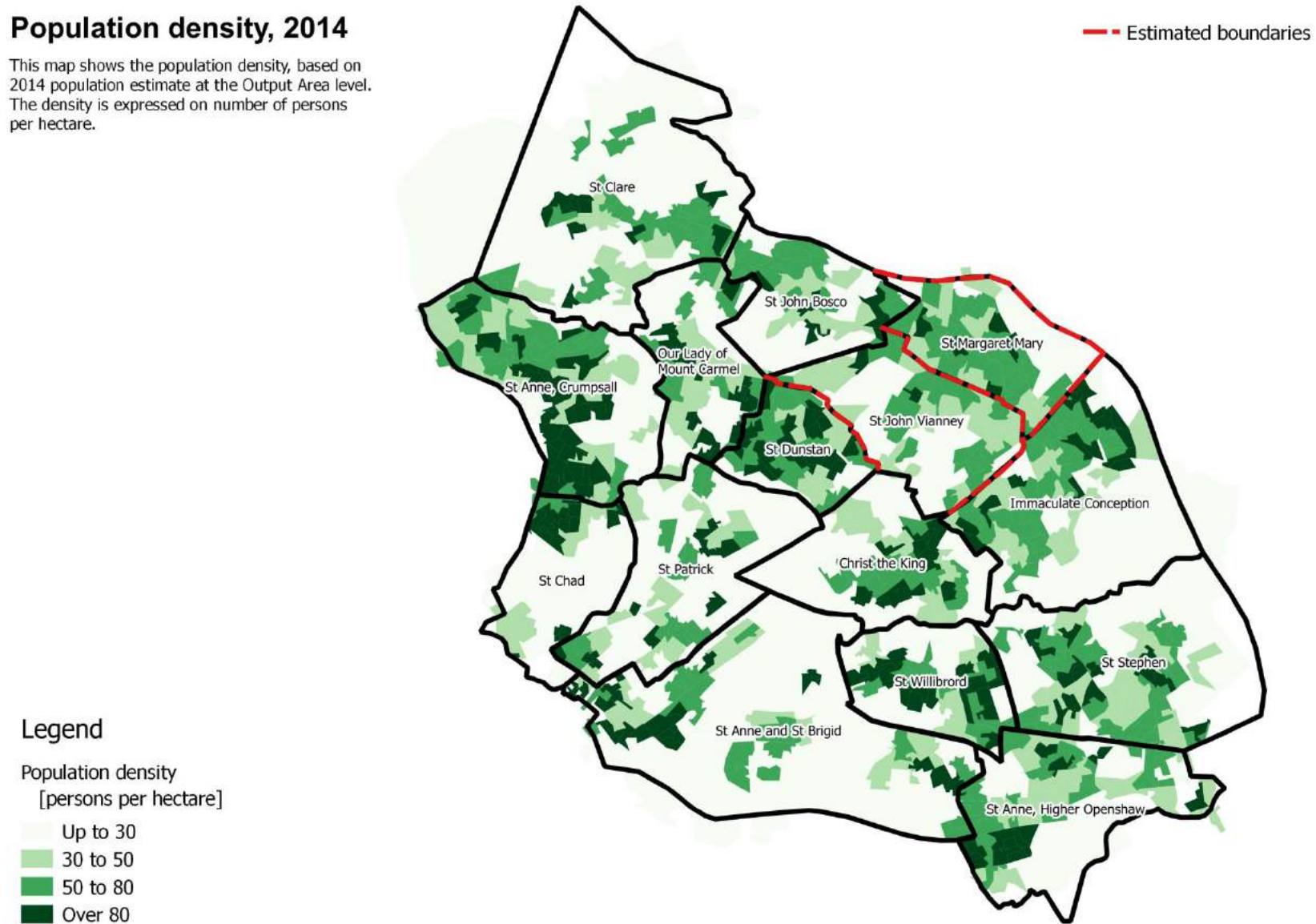
This map shows the location of churches in each parish in the deanery.

Population density, 2014

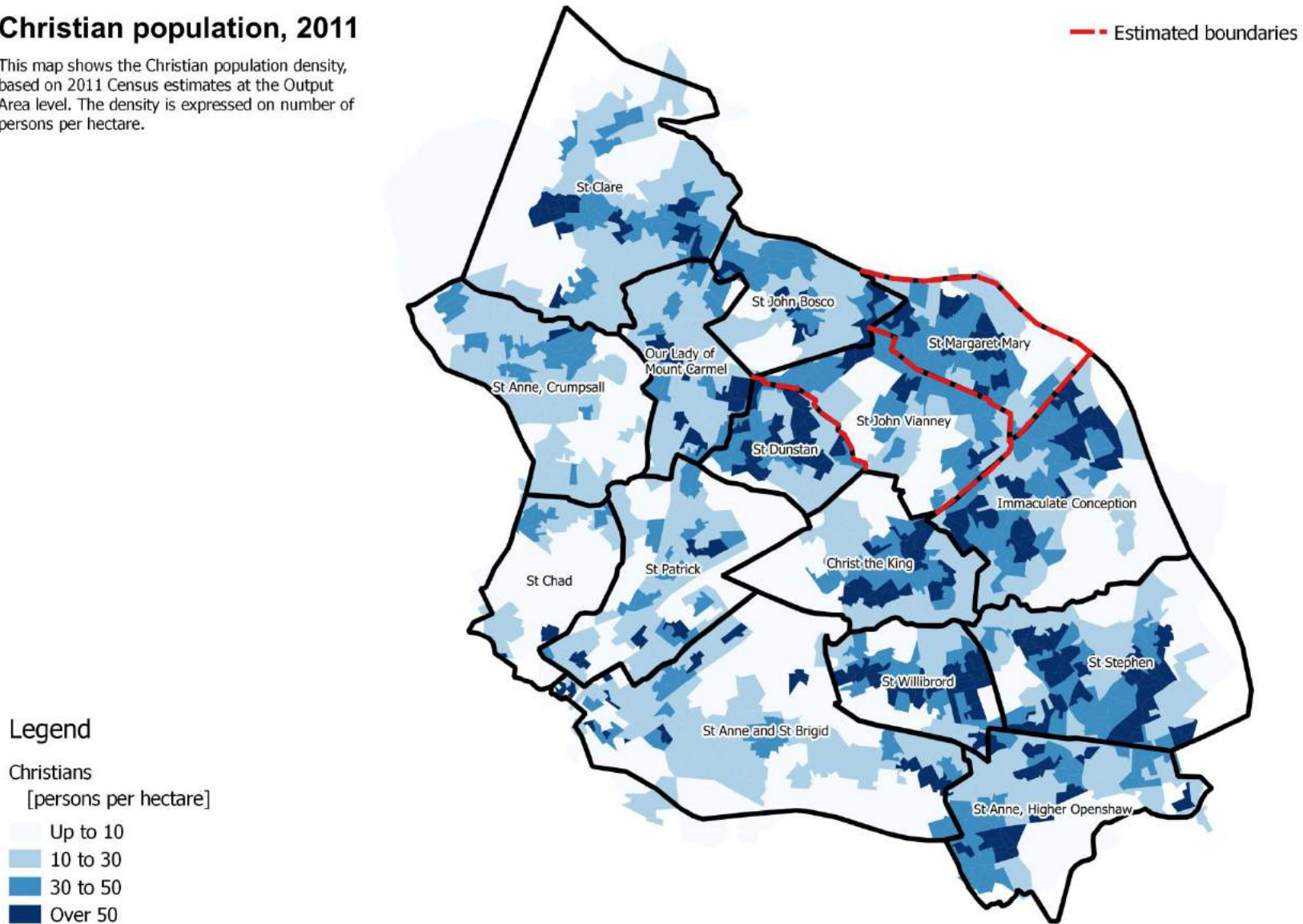
This map shows the population density, based on 2014 population estimate at the Output Area level. The density is expressed on number of persons per hectare.

This map shows the Christian population density, based on 2011 Census estimates at the Output Area level. The density is expressed on number of persons per hectare.



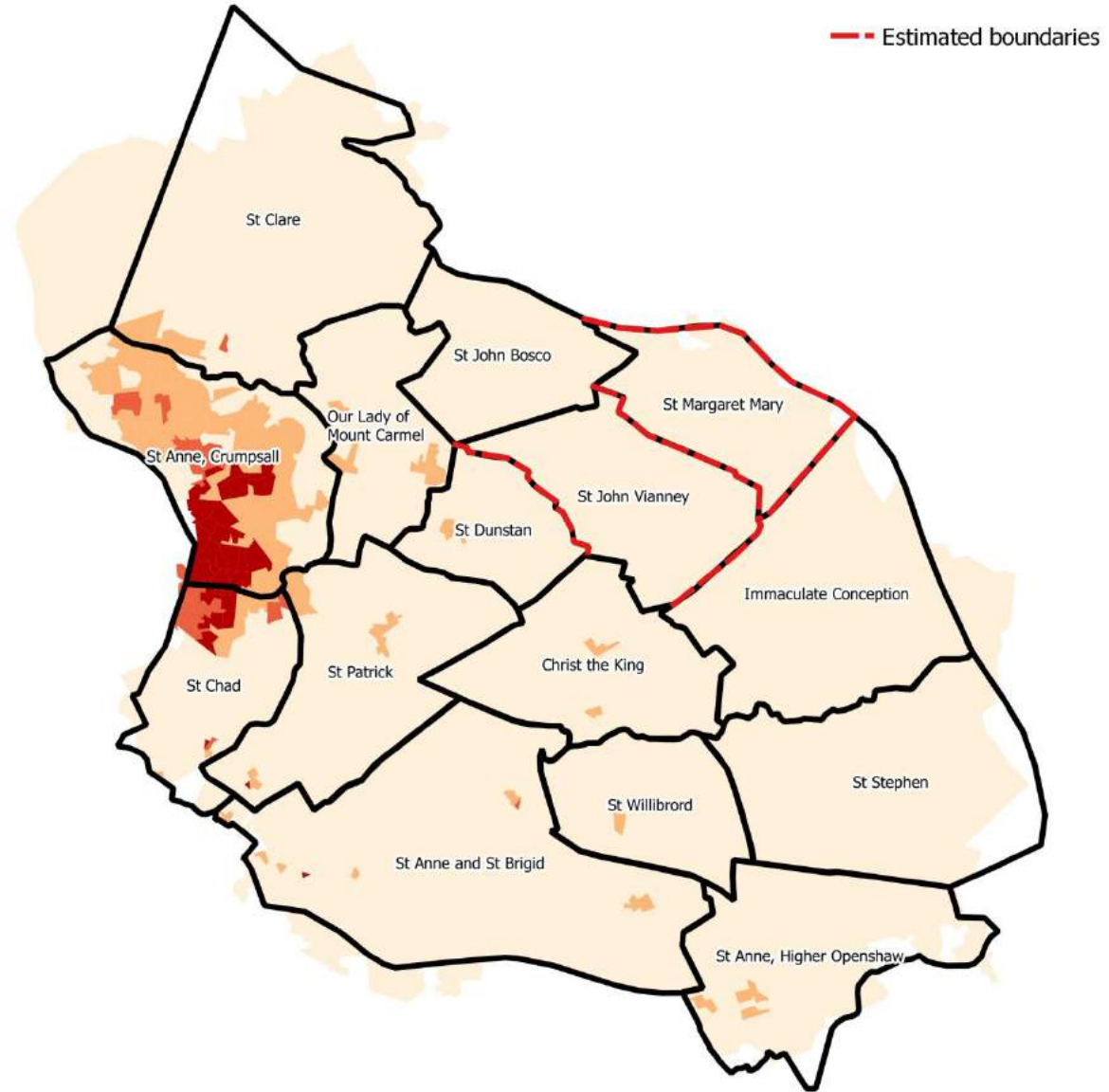
Map 5: Muslim population, 2011

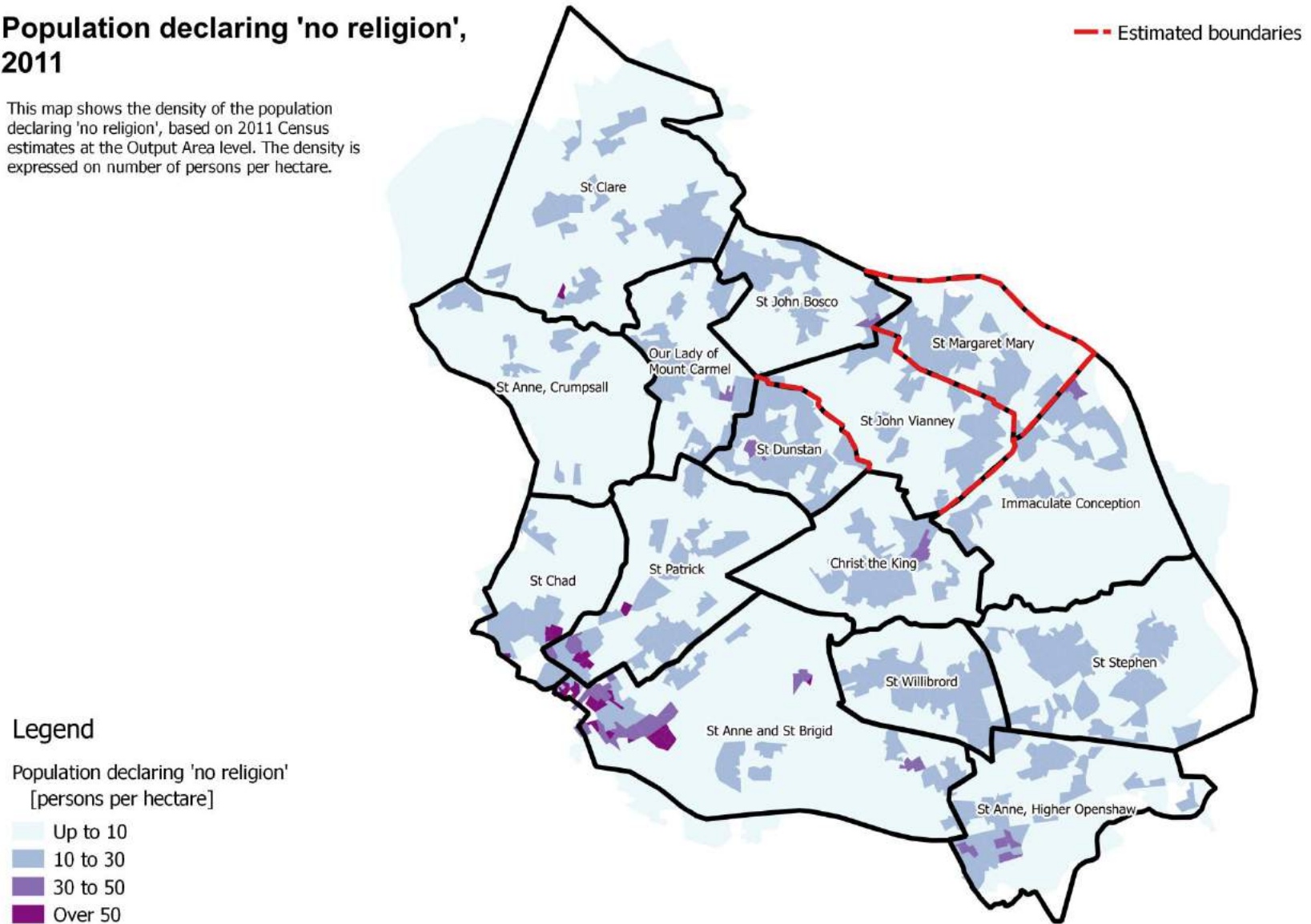

Annex B: Data limitations

Timeliness

The population size for each parish is based on mid-2014 estimates (30th June 2014). Remaining analysis is based on Census 2011 data and hence captures the population characteristics as they were on 27th March 2011. The socio-demographic characteristics of the population could have changed between then and the time of writing of this report. Some areas, for example where there is a lot of newly built houses or significant student or migrant population will be more dynamic, hence changes over time may be more significant.

Coverage

Good geographical coverage has been achieved when matching statistical areas to most parish areas, mainly because both statistical area boundaries and parish boundary tend not to cut across main roads. More sparsely populated areas in Trafford were more difficult to match. Since extra area included or removed is mainly industrial, it is thought that population characteristics are not significantly affected. The reported overall population density for affected parishes is most likely an underestimate.

Data matching

A spatial join between parish areas and 'Population Weighted Centroids' was applied to determine Output Areas which fall within each parish boundary. This automated method assigned nearly 99 percent of all OAs in the deanery to parishes. A very small number (about 1 percent) was manually adjusted, to ensure good coverage and capture of the key population features.

Non- response

Like any survey, Census also faces issues with non-response. Due to ONS efforts, this is very low, at about 5% nationally. The lowest disaggregation of non-response statistic was available at the Local Authority Level and for the Manchester City it was 89%. This may be slightly different for smaller areas within Local Authority.

Accuracy and correctness

The answers to Census questionnaire reflect respondents' perception and it is possible that some of the answers are incorrect, due to genuine mistakes or deception. Some of the respondents could also refuse to answer some of the questions. ONS has a methodology for checking responses for internal consistency and removes inconsistent or clearly incorrect entries. This in turn means that the base population for each characteristic may be slightly different.
